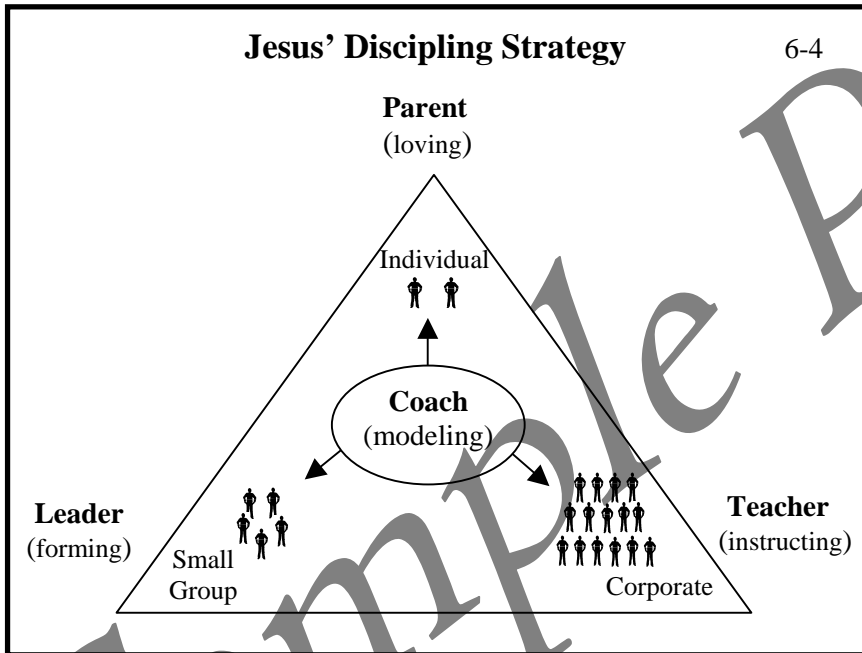


C. Make Disciples...(the Task).

(Suggested teaching time: 25 minutes)

Jesus' discipleship strategy of reproducing Himself and making disciples consisted of four key elements:



← Show Transparency 6-4.

Explain to the group that Jesus exposed the disciples to four different settings that He intentionally used to shape them.

Jesus' Role	Setting	Discipling Strategy
1. As Parent	Individual	Called & Loved Them
2. As Leader	Small Group	Formed Them
3. As Teacher	Corporate	Instructed Them
4. As Coach	Model of Each	Modeled By Example

← Point out that Jesus discipleship strategy assists disciples through the five phases of discipleship.

1. Individually ~ As a Parent.

As a Father, Jesus called and loved His 12 disciples individually. He loved them as a father would love his children. (Jn 1:47-48)

a. Meet Individually.

Meeting personally provides the greatest opportunity for trust to develop. Trust is needed for a deeper relationship and provides opportunity to connect the young disciple with other believers.

- Meet together regularly. Invite them into your home.
- Begin to identify their needs. [See Appendix 6A]
- Engage in fun events (i.e. healthy recreation).
