

B. Two Distinct Types of Ministry Teams.

(Suggested teaching time: 10 minutes)

1. Ministry Task Teams.

A task team is a group of people who come together to accomplish a task that has been predetermined by a leader or leadership team.

Examples include:

- Worship teams prepare & present music for church services.
- Maintenance teams clean and maintain buildings.
- Nursery teams are task teams that take care of small children and babies.

2. Ministry Leadership Teams.

A leadership team is a small group of leaders with complementary gifts and skills who are committed to one another's growth and success. They, in turn, lead a larger group of people in pursuing a common vision.

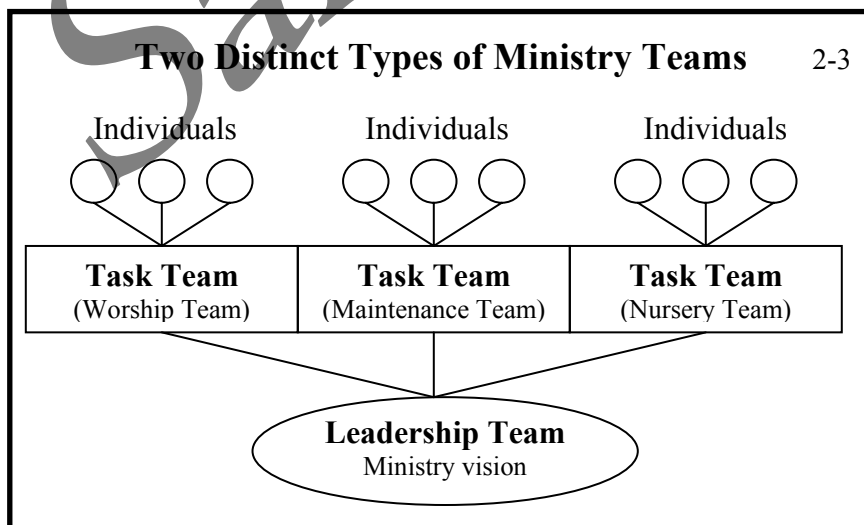
Examples include:

- A team of elders is a leadership team that leads a church.
- A team of diverse leaders may lead a youth ministry.
- Hopefully, each ministry area in a church would be led by a leadership team of diverse strengths.
